For more than 20 years, Corpus Christi has been known as America's Birdiest City, and there's an annual festival to celebrate. The Birdiest Festival in America is perfectly timed during the spring migration and is held every April at the South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center. Over 200 different species of birds can be found in the area as birds prepare for their long journey north as winter temperatures give way to warmer weather.


TRUE SOUTH TEXAS HOSPITALITY

A variety of factors make Corpus Christi such a bird haven. It's in the middle of Central Flyway, the major migratory route for birds traveling from the Arctic to Central and South America. The area also boasts incredibly diverse natural environments, from salt marshes, beaches and bays to woodlands and grasslands. These habitats offer many types of birds ideal spots to rest and plenty of insects, berries and fish to feed on before they continue on their way.

A COAST WITH THE MOST

No matter what season you're here, you'll find birding is a year-round activity. Corpus Christi sits near the middle of the Great Texas Coastal Birding Trail, a well-marked trail system featuring amenities like boardwalks, observation platforms and landscaping to attract native wildlife. Other popular birding sites in and around Corpus Christi include the South Texas Botanical Gardens & Nature Center, Hans & Pat Suter Wildlife Refuge, Sunset Lake Park, and Oso Bay Wetlands Preserve & Learning Center.
